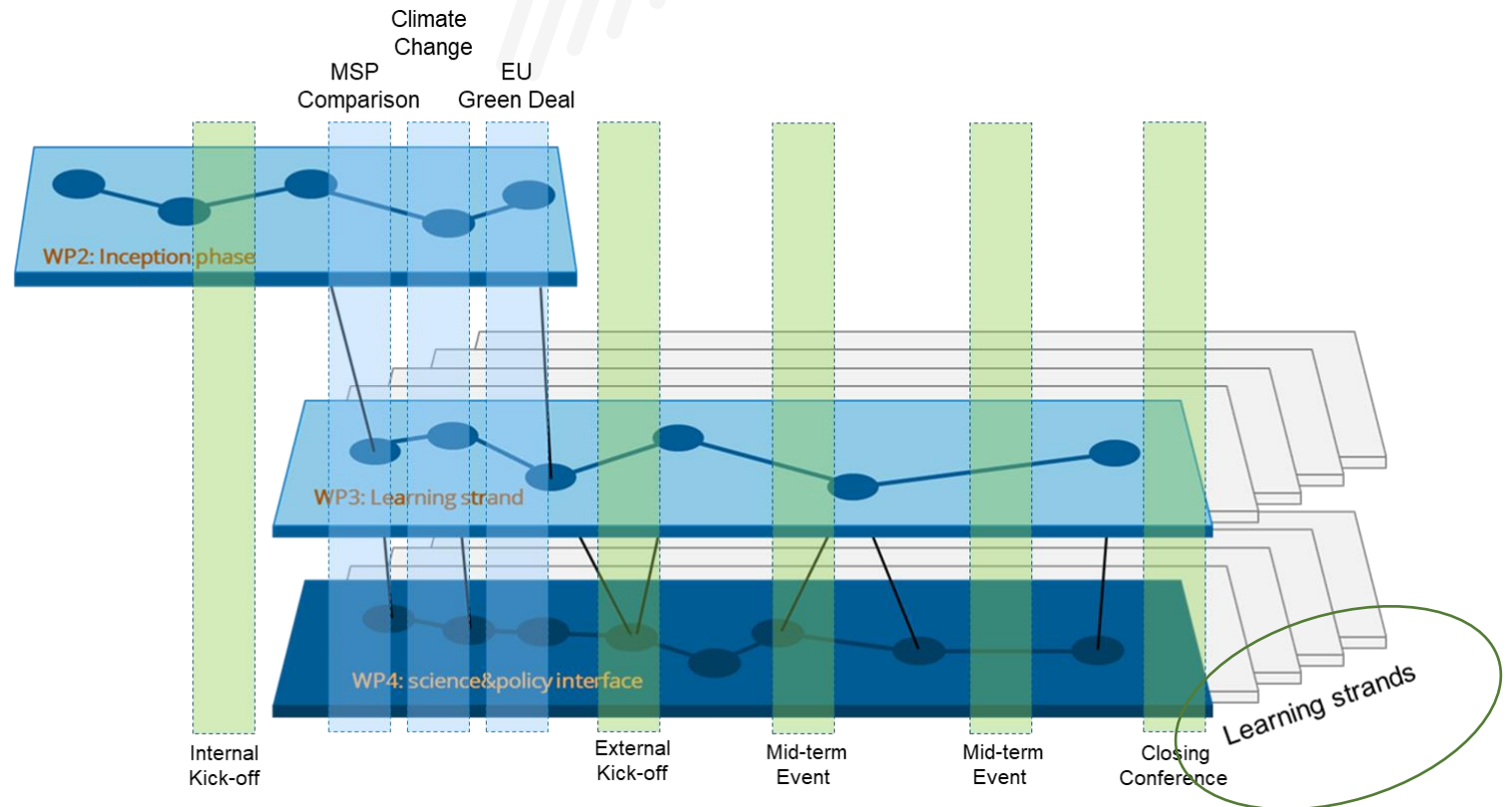
Challenges for MSP

- MSP as an instrument to steer these developments in the right direction across borders

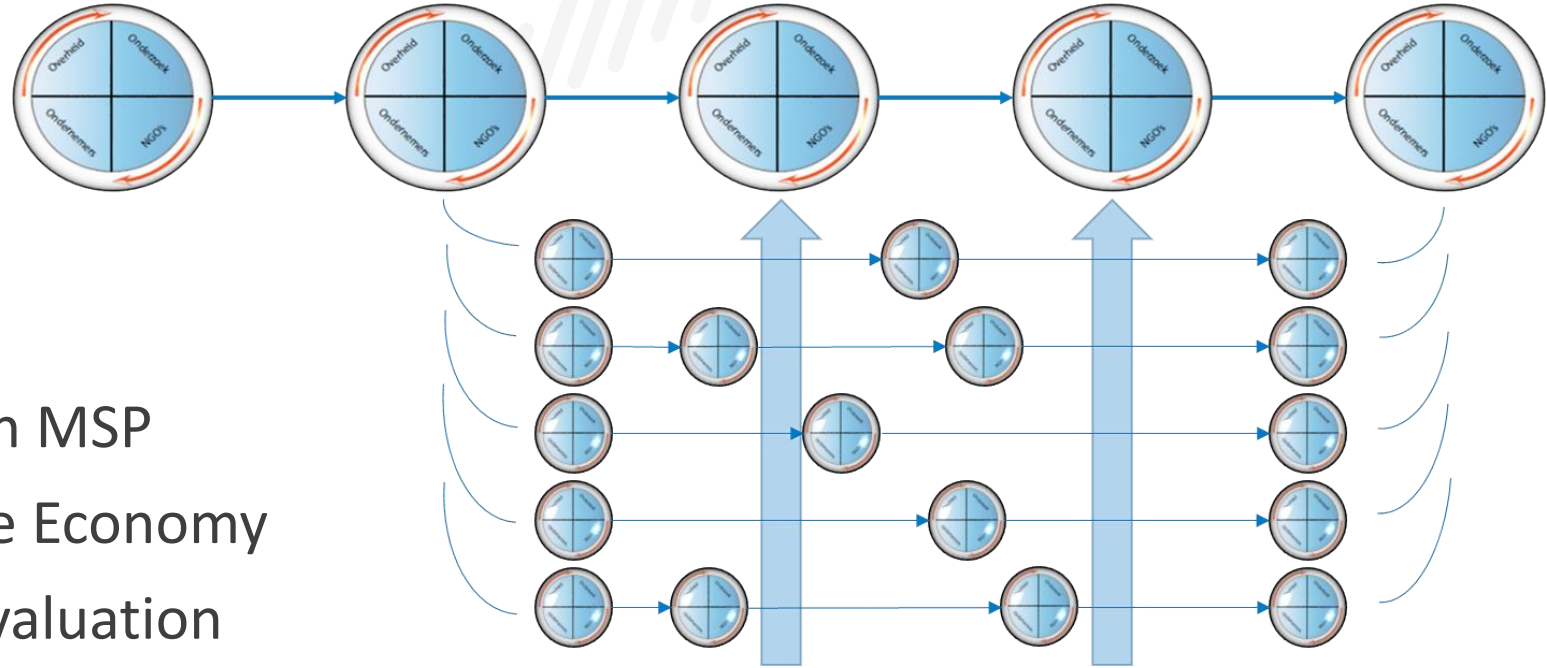

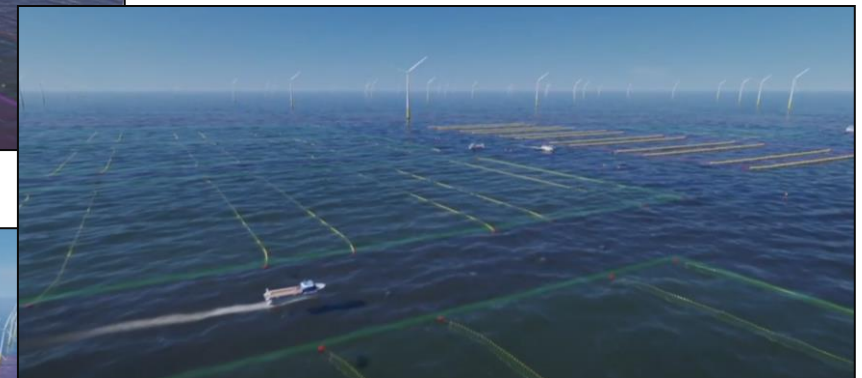
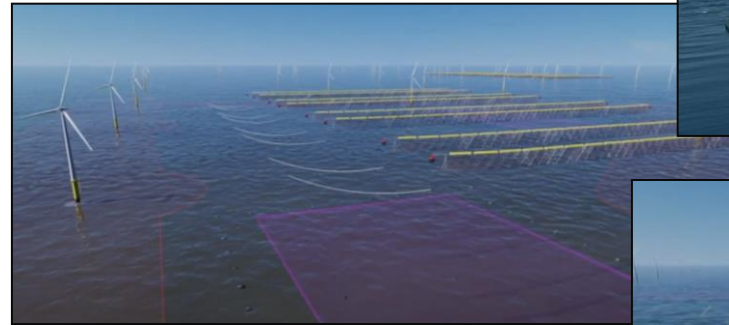
